

ANNUAL REPORT 2017



CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Your Board has had an active year reviewing our current methods. We are looking to be more effective in promoting the future of the sport.

Auckland Bowls continues to organise competitions for its members involving 38 separate events with total entries exceeding 5000 participants. The most popular event was Saturday Interclub with over 750 players. It is noteworthy that the Auckland College Pairs Championship attracted 32 boys and 31 girls pairs. The World Masters Games was a highlight of the later part of the season. Well done to Carlton Cornwall, Mt Eden and Remuera for hosting this event.

The Trusts NZ Open tournament continues to be a major sporting event popular with over 1100 entries with excellent TV coverage and good management by our staff and the Blockhouse Bay Bowling Club.

The major initiative this year has been our promotion of development agreements with clubs. This promotion has been a mixed success with three agreements in place and others under discussion. We will need to provide better communication, more proactive leadership and greater management focus in the coming year on ways to assist clubs to be successful and sustainable.

It is time for members to have a more realistic idea of the facts, risks and opportunities involved in Auckland Bowls financial arrangements. For that reason we have restructured our financial reporting format this year to describe the net cost of our main activities rather than the old style mixture of costs unrelated to what is being produced. The current funding of Auckland Bowls activities is totally reliant on continuing income from grants, fundraising and sponsorship. Basic events and competitions run at a loss even when our total affiliation fee income is allocated to this activity.

The Board has recently decided that it is time for it to take a more proactive leadership role in involving clubs to come to grips with how to promote and develop the sport.

Over the last seven years seven of the original 52 clubs have closed. Only 10 clubs have increased their membership with 42 losing members. It is significant that some of these 42 clubs have lost between half and two thirds of their members with the average club losing over one third of their members. Also 19 of the 45 current clubs have made no return of their financial performance under Incorporated Society requirements. Of the 26 that have made returns, seven are showing a loss before depreciation and 12 are showing a loss after depreciation. The focus of many club's resources and arrangements is on survival but that plan isn't working.

There has been a recent emphasis on promoting social/casual/corporate bowls with such participant numbers reaching about 18,000. Under the current model the

potential for increasing these participants is limited by the availability and skill of the dwindling numbers of individual club volunteers and the suitability of formats and existing facilities.

If the 17 clubs that own their own properties were to manage their assets in such a way as to create with other adjacent clubs a number of first class facilities strategically placed around Auckland the sport would be well placed for the future. On the other hand if such clubs simply develop their own sometimes limited sites without regard to developing hubs for the sport as a whole a major opportunity will be lost.

Auckland Bowls and club leaders need to work together, take a fresh approach and marshal resources to enable us to promote and develop the sport rather than just allowing the current trends to reach an inevitable conclusion.

Delegates on the evening of our AGM will have the opportunity after the formal business is concluded to hear and discuss our presentation on how we can make a positive effort to work together so clubs and grouping of clubs can be successful and sustainable.

We are indebted to all Board members for their willing contribution- especially to Murray Doreen for his energy as President, ably assisted by Jill Fraser as Vice President. Both have kept closely in touch with members throughout the year. Murray also acted as Board Chairman until October 2016 when I was appointed.

It is with sadness that I report that two of our valued Board members Peter McKechnie and Ieremia (Chris) Salesa passed away on 7th June.

Peter has made a significant contribution to many areas of bowling in Auckland over the years. As a Board member we always appreciated his clear thinking and ability to sum things up so succinctly. Chris joined the Board during the year and has given voice to Pacifica views as well as high performance bowling aspects. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of both Peter and Chris.

I wish to express thanks to our small management team of General Manager Phil Vyver, Kristina Fry, Mia Smith and Paul Tuckley for their important contributions.

We also want to highlight and thank all the many unsung volunteers carrying out important roles running Auckland Bowls Committees, Associations and events and those who have willingly given advice and much appreciated assistance.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Auckland Bowls has had a tough year both on and off the green. Following the highs of last year with wins by the Auckland Men's Representatives Side and an overall growth in participation numbers 2016-2017 has been less positive.

Membership numbers have continued to decline from 4807 last year down to 4587, a loss of 220 members. The casual participant market has also come back from the highs of last year with a decline of 1005 participants down to 17,194. However these figures are still 22% higher than five years ago.

The Club Development Agreements have been promoted to all clubs. Whilst the initial take up has been slow, it is encouraging that a number of clubs are working through this process and considering ways that they can promote and grow participation and membership.

This remains a major priority for Auckland Bowls. If we have strong clubs then we will have a strong sport. We must work together if we are to achieve this aim.

Congratulations to the Howick and Howick Women's Bowling Clubs who have now formally amalgamated. It is also pleasing that Onehunga with Hillsboro and Hillsboro Women have agreed to amalgamate under a new name for next season. Watch this space!

We also welcome Papatoetoe Hunters Corner Bowling Club to our Centre following Bowls NZ approval for this club to transfer from Counties Manukau.

STRATEGIC PLAN

We have once again had a thorough review of the Auckland Bowls Strategic Plan as we try to unlock the formula that will enable our sport to succeed for many years to come.

Fundamentally our vision remains the same – we want 'More people playing bowls more often'.

Under our purpose to 'Lead and develop the growth of bowls in Auckland' we have five strategic goals to achieve over the next three years:

1. Ensure a sustainable network of clubs
2. Communicate effectively with all partners and increase the profile of bowls in Auckland
3. Increase participation by providing quality bowling experiences
4. Develop and maintain key partnerships with enable us to achieve success
5. Develop the infrastructure that enables Auckland Bowls to deliver an excellent service

The feedback that has been provided by members through a club forum and an online survey has been used extensively to inform our plan. Thank you to those members that provided input to this process. Consistent themes of leadership, communication and growth came through in

the feedback. These have all been included in the plan.

The presentation at the conclusion of the AGM will provide more detail.

OUR SPONSORS AND FUNDERS

Auckland Bowls is supported by an excellent group of sponsors and funders, most of whom have supported us for a number of years.

The Trusts have continued their support of The Trusts New Zealand Open and together with the event sponsors – Ryman Healthcare, Aero Bowls, Dilmah, Hunter Bowls, Auckland Council, The Trusts Community Foundation and Blue Waters Community Trust - help to make this event a success.

Blue Waters Community Trust remains a significant contributor to Auckland Bowls and we thank the Trustees for their ongoing commitment to bowls in Auckland.

FINANCE

The financial year has been successful with an operating surplus of \$24,711 recorded (2016: \$36,343). This includes a donation from the Mission Bay Bowling Club of \$25,852 following their closure. Thank you to Mission Bay for this contribution. These funds have not yet been spent but we are required to declare the income in the year it is received. Plans will be made for the appropriate expenditure of these funds. When the cost of depreciation and income from the Kimberley Investment Fund is added, an overall surplus of \$80,541 has been achieved – a significant improvement on last year (\$8,938).

The format of the Statement of Financial Performance has been revised to more accurately show the work that is undertaken by Auckland Bowls and the income and expenditure related to each. The key headings are:

- Events
- Club Development and Support
- High Performance
- Youth Bowls
- New Zealand Open
- Fundraising and Administration

This format highlights the importance of outside funding to Auckland Bowls with all but Fundraising and Administration running at a loss.

Club Levies make up just 5.5% of total income and have been entirely allocated to Event Income. Bowls NZ run a breakeven budget for events. Noting the current deficit of \$96,000, if we were to follow this model the income and/or expenditure would need to significantly change if we are to achieve a breakeven result.

The Board has proposed a small increase to the Club Levies of \$2 per member to take the fee from \$16 to \$18 + GST. The fee charged by Auckland Bowls remains the lowest of any Centre in the country – even when taking into account the proposed increase.

The Balance Sheet remains very strong. The funds held and managed by the Kimberley Investment Committee (see separate report) continue to grow at a steady rate, with an impressive 10.52% return for the year.

MARKETING

In line with the Strategic Plan, marketing has become a much greater focus for Auckland Bowls. During the year Paul Tuckley joined the staff as Marketing Executive. This has been a major step forward. A Marketing Plan has now been written and a number of key tasks are underway.

The first project has been to conduct market research with the objective to identify the perceptions of non-bowlers to the game of bowls and to understand reasons behind why they don't play and what would attract them to the play the game. The results will then help better inform how we should be promoting bowls.

A number of other initiatives will be rolled out over the next 12 months that will assist Auckland Bowls and clubs to better promote the sport.

THE TRUSTS NEW ZEALAND OPEN 2017

The event was held in February for the first time. A key reason was the better weather. Unfortunately Mother Nature had other ideas and the tournament was significantly affected by rain. But with a lot of hard work from both staff and the huge number of volunteers we managed to pull off another successful tournament. Thank you to all involved.

The Trusts New Zealand Open remains a significant event on the bowls calendar each year, not just for current bowlers but as a way to promote and attract new participants to our sport. Live television coverage provided by Sky TV is an important component of the event.

In 2018 we will again be running the event in February - but the weather will be better!

UMPIRES

Thank you to each and every umpire that has officiated over the past year. Whether it be once or many times your support is greatly appreciated! Put simply we could not run our events without you! This season saw an increased number of appointments with Auckland hosting the National Interclub as well as the World Masters Games.

More umpires are required however, and I know this is an area that the Umpires Association has been working on. If you would like to be an umpire or measurer then put your



hand up and get involved! There is a pathway that can lead you right through to officiating at World Bowls if that is what you want to achieve.

EVENTS AND OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

To the Operations Committee members, Chairperson Jill Fraser, Helen Blick, Paulene Murdoch and Mia Smith, Auckland Bowls Events Manager, a very big thank you for your assistance in the running of all the events this season and also for your support and expertise whenever required. Thank you to John Ross, Alison Rennie and Nick Bell who were also on the committee earlier in the year.

The season saw 2,188 (2016: 2,212) entrants in Auckland Bowls run events for a total of 5,419 (2016: 5,545) participants. Although this is a slight decrease on the previous season, this is largely due to The Trusts New Zealand Open. Most Centre Events actually had an increase in entries this season resulting in 4% growth which is very pleasing.

YOUTH

The Schools Programme has had a challenging year with College Sport considering whether or not bowls should continue to be recognised as a sport at Secondary School level. Thankfully with the support of a number of schools we were able to convince them that bowls did have a place.

The Auckland Secondary Schools Pairs Championships drew 63 teams and was played with great enjoyment and competitiveness on all three greens at Carlton Cornwall. It was a pleasure to see so many young people enjoying our sport.

This is just the beginning however and more needs to be done in this area throughout 2017 and beyond.

THANKS

Thank you to the staff of Auckland Bowls, Mia Smith, Kristina Fry and Paul Tuckley for your hard work throughout the year. I would also like to thank Shelley Hodgkinson, who finished with Auckland Bowls at the end of March. Shelley has made a great contribution to Club Development over the past five years.

Finally I wish to express my thanks to the Board of Auckland Bowls under the leadership of Bruce Anderson and earlier in the year, Murray Dorreen.

Legal Name of Entity: Auckland Bowls Incorporated

Type of Entity: Incorporated Society - No 222253

Entity's Purpose:

Auckland Bowls is the regional governing body for lawn bowls and is committed to delivering a sport that is enjoyable, entertaining and accessible to the people of Auckland and visitors to our region. We are committed to more people playing Bowls more often.

Entity's Mission:

Lead and develop the growth of Bowls in Auckland

Entity's Structure:

Auckland Bowls is governed by a seven person Board, with the President and Vice President elected by the members; and five independent Board Members recommended to the AGM for appointment by the Selection Panel in accordance with the Constitution. Auckland Bowls currently has a staff of three fulltime and one part-time person, who are based at the office at the Mt Eden Bowling Club.

Main Source of Income:

Income is generated in the main through membership fees, grants, sponsorship, contracts and event based activity.

Entity's Reliance on Volunteers and Donated Goods or Services:

Like many not-for-profit organisations, Auckland Bowls is dependent on volunteers who assist with all facets of delivering the sport to the members and participants. Without these volunteers the organisation could not function.

Description of the Entity's Outcomes:

Auckland Bowls is responsible for the administration, promotion and development of the Game of Bowls within its defined boundaries. This includes providing support services for its affiliated clubs; events and tournaments for members and visiting participants; and to promote and grow the sport.

Description and Quantification of the Entity's Outputs:

Auckland Bowls has a combined membership and participation base of 21,766 (2016: 23,006). The total number of entries in Auckland Bowls run events was 2,188 (2016: 2,212), for a total of 5,419 participants (2016: 5,545).

Additional Information

Auckland Bowls was first established in 1896 and has 45 affiliated clubs. It covers the geographical area from the Auckland Harbour Bridge in the north; to Papatoetoe in the south; from Piha in the west; to Maraetai in the east.



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

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost. Reliance is placed on the fact that the business is a going concern.

Auckland Bowls Incorporated has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Financial Reports are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Financial Reports are prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and financial position have been applied.

(a) Valuation of Assets

Fixed Assets have been recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Listed investments have been recorded at market value (refer notes 5 and 6). Movements in market value of listed investments are reflected in the Investment Revaluation Reserve. Other investments are valued at cost plus accrued interest.

Accounts Receivable have been recorded at estimated realisable value. Where a debt has been considered irrecoverable, it has been written off in the Statement of Financial Performance.

(b) Depreciation of Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets have been depreciated on a diminishing value basis over the expected life of the asset with the exception of Leasehold Improvements which are being depreciated over the anticipated term of the tenancy lease.

(c) Goods and Services Tax

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

(d) Tax

Auckland Bowls is an Incorporated Society and an amateur sports body and has been granted exemption from income tax by Inland Revenue under Section CB 4 (1) (h) of the Income Tax Act 1994.

(e) Leases

Operating lease payments, where the lessors effectively retain substantially all of the risks and benefits of ownership, are included in the determination of the net surplus in equal instalments over the lease term.

(f) Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the financial year.

6. RAWHITI PROCEEDS

At an SGM of the Rawhiti Bowling Club (RBC) on 28th September 2014 the members resolved to transfer certain assets (\$5,413,867.92) to ABI to establish a Fund to be known as the Rawhiti Fund. The Rawhiti Fund is administered by ABI in accordance with the Deed of Agreement made between RBC and ABI dated 11th May 2015.

At the same SGM a separate sum of \$1,109,997 was set aside for specific grants to be given to clubs where members of RBC had joined. ABI is managing these funds on behalf of RBC. Under the agreement ABI received an initial fee of \$7,000, plus the ongoing interest whilst the funds remain under ABI management. Following distributions to approved clubs the fund balance is \$8,400 (2016: \$172,422).

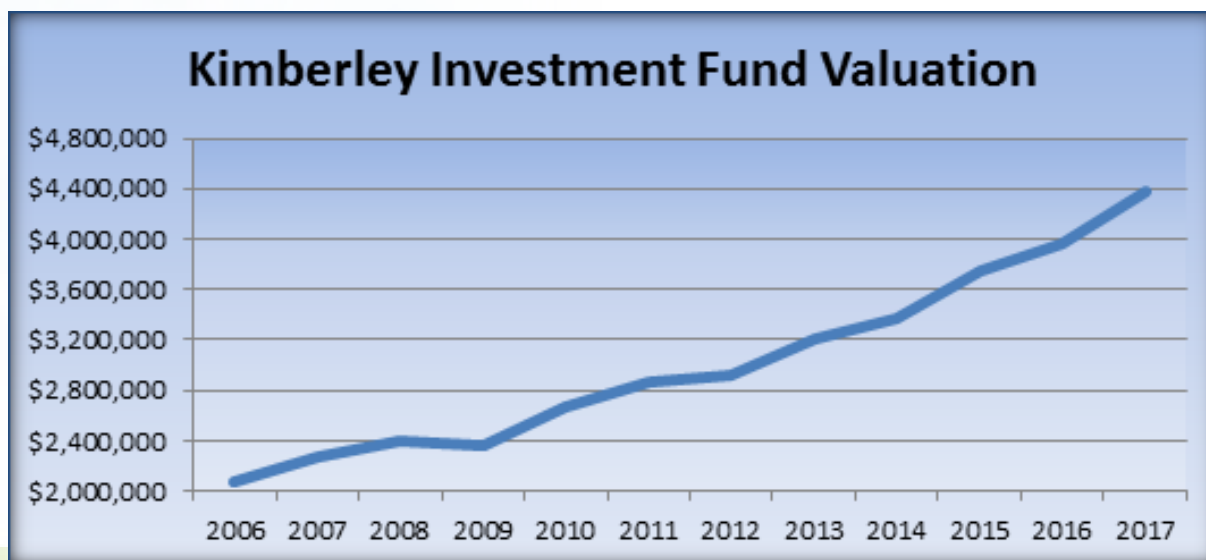
KIMBERLEY INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

In 2006 Auckland Bowls received \$2,065,000 from the sale of its Kimberley Road property. The Kimberley Investment Committee was then set up and currently consists of Graeme Bennett, Bob Croker, David Timms and Hadden Vernon. These members are appointed by the Auckland Bowls Board for a two year term, with a rotation policy in place where two members are eligible for reappointment each year.

The funds are administered by the above committee and have a current market value as at 30 April 2017 of \$4,380,908. This represents an increase of 10.45% on last year (\$3,966,332). In accordance with the Statement of Investment Policies the portfolio has been diversified and now includes:

RAWHITI FUND COMMITTEE REPORT

Following the sale of the Rawhiti Bowling Club a Deed of Agreement was signed by Auckland Bowls and the Rawhiti Bowling Club. As part of the Deed a Rawhiti Fund Sub-Committee was set up comprising two members appointed by the Rawhiti Bowling Club, two members appointed by the Auckland Bowls Board and one independent member.

The current members of the Rawhiti Fund Sub-Committee are Graeme Bennett (Independent Chairman); Rod Colledge and Gerard Hulst (Rawhiti); Peter McKechnie and Michael Feek (Auckland Bowls).

The Deed followed the Resolutions of the members of Rawhiti at the time of dissolution and sets out how the funds can be invested and what they can be spent on. The terms are as follows:

- The Rawhiti Fund must be invested only in prudent term deposits
- The Rawhiti Fund is to be used and expended for the significant changes required to advance, develop, promote and grow the game of bowls in Auckland
- The Rawhiti Fund may be expended (in whole or part) to finance the construction of indoor bowling facilities in the central Auckland area, subject to any such indoor facilities first being the subject of a feasibility study which indicates that they are likely to be sustainable and in the long term interests of bowls in central Auckland; and
- Income from the Rawhiti Fund may be made available for grants to clubs that can demonstrate ongoing viability in terms of finance and membership.

On the 24th August 2015 the Rawhiti Bowling Club transferred \$5,413,868 to Auckland Bowls. As at the 30th April 2017 the fund is \$5,577,048 (2016: \$5,456,270) after allowing for income and expenditure since inception.

The committee has agreed to allocate \$2.5m of the fund over the next five years towards Club Development Agreement's which Auckland Bowls is currently setting up with a number of clubs. The remainder of the fund has not been allocated to any project at this stage.

It has also been agreed that the income will not be made available for grants to clubs at the moment. This will allow more time for the income to grow.

Thank you to my fellow committee members for their commitment and I look forward to working with you throughout the coming year.
