# 2.7 CEO Summary Report

The paper was taken as read and the CEO asked for questions and feedback. Highlighting key points:

- The Board Strategic Session will happen on the afternoon of 9 March. A Strategic Pack will be circulated for pre-reading before the day.
- Bowls New Zealand (BNZ) have taken responsibility of the budget for the upcoming Oceania Challenge which was the preferred outcome. To contribute to the costs (i.e., venue) BNZ applied to Blue Waters Community Trust. The Trust preferred that the contribution came through Bowls Auckland Inc, therefore, proposed, and approved BAI's application, plus the \$7,500 contribution to BNZ for the Oceania Challenge.

• The current support from BAI in terms of flood/cyclone relief is to continue to support individual clubs that have been impacted once clubs (and insurers) have had a chance

In the meantime, we will continue to communicate with clubs and explore ways in which we can tangibly assist.

- New Lynn Bowling Club are having an SGM on 21 March. Mark Cameron (CEO, Bowls NZ) will act at the independent Chair, and the BAI CEO will be the independent Observer.
- March is a busy delivery month including the Auckland Secondary School Pairs which have pleasing team registrations at 52 (or 104 students).
- The Premier Bowls Auckland team/s are currently preparing to travel south to compete in the Intercentre Tournament in Christchurch in mid-March alongside the Premier Two team who are playing in the Octagonal tournament over the same time.
- The Rawhiti Committee approved Facility Enhancement grants to replace existing carpet greens for Howick Bowling Club, Mt Eden Bowling Club and Glen Eden Bowling Club, at their last meeting.
