Entry Conditions

- All participants must be full-playing members of the same Bowls Auckland affiliated club having won the respective discipline at their club championship event.
 - o Runner-up sides are not permitted to enter.
- Where a club does not have sufficient members to run a (Triples / Fours) tournament, a club may enter a side uncontested with prior approval from Bowls Auckland.
- Teams found playing with ineligible players will be immediately disqualified
 - Clubs are responsible for ensuring participants in their club championships are eligible to play

 - Substitutes

Event Entry

- Entries open for all events on 21st March 2025
- Entries close three (3) weeks before each respective event.
- All entries are received via Bowlshub only, all entries must be linked to player profiles.
 - o Entries via phone, text or email will not be accepted.

Draw & Venues

- All fixtures will be randomly drawn into a step ladder final bracket.
- Draw/s will be published, with hosting venues on Bowlshub.

Event Schedule

- Event Schedule is subject to the number of entries, matches may be split between am and pm playing times on day one to maximise full green usage across rounds.
- Check the draw on Bowlshub for playing times,
- A player/team may play up to a maximum of three rounds per day.

Bowls Auckland 2024-2025 Event Conditions of Play Champion of Champion (COC) Events

Dead End - Mixed Pairs

- A dead end shall be played using the same player sequence. (e.g. the same players playing the lead bowls, regardless of the direction of play)
- In all other disciplines, a dead end will be replayed law 20.1

Marking (Singles)

- Round One Each player must be accompanied by one non-playing marker for the first scheduled round the player is competing.
 Markers will be randomly assigned by the umpire on duty.
 - If two players, drawn against each other fail to provide a marker, the match may be played without a marker. (If one is not available)
- Subsequent rounds will be marked by losing players of the previous round.
- Semi-Final and Finals (Sunday) Markers will be supplied by the controlling body

National Pathway

- The winner of each discipline will qualify to represent Auckland in the National Pathway
- It is the responsibility of the team to enter themselves in the national event using the information provided to them by Bowls Auckland.
- Travel Allowance (where applicable) will be paid to the player/team once entry has been confirmed in the national final.

Appendix

Bowls New Zealand Pathway – National Entry Conditions (Multi-Member Entry)

- a) Pathway Definition:
 - 1. Club Championship
 - 2. Centre Champion of Champion
 - 3. National Champion of Champion
 - 4. World Singles (Singles only)
- b) If a player / and or player in a team wins a club championship competition that qualifies them for a centre champion of champions event, which goes on to a national champion of champions event, they are ineligible to enter another club's competition in that discipline.
- c) A player and/or player in a team can only win one club championship or centre champion of champions event per discipline in a single season.
- d) A player and/or player in a team can only play in one active club championship discipline at any one time. For clarity, the player may enter another club's (if they are a full playing member) championship in the same discipline ONLY after the first club's championship in the same discipline has concluded and/or they are knocked out of that club's event.
- e) Where an ineligible team has won a club championship, they shall not be entitled to enter the centre COC event, nor use a replacement player as outlined below. Any team found to be competing with an ineligible player per the above will be instantly disqualified.

Acquired team members/replacements:

- It is expected that the player/team that has played and won the club championship will represent the club in this event:
 - o a) Singles players cannot be replaced.
 - o b) Only one replacement is allowed for each side of Pairs, Triples or Fours.
 - o c) The club is at liberty to replace a player who is not available for reasons of:
 - i) Medical
 - ii) Jury duty
 - iii) Bereavement of a close family member
 - iv) Work commitments arising after the completion of the club championship.
 - d) Other than the approved reasons above or if after the entry has been submitted the club requires a replacement, then the required form (available from Bowls Auckland website) must be completed and submitted to Bowls Auckland, for approval by 12 pm Friday. Failure to submit the form in a reasonable and timely manner will result in the disqualification of the team.
